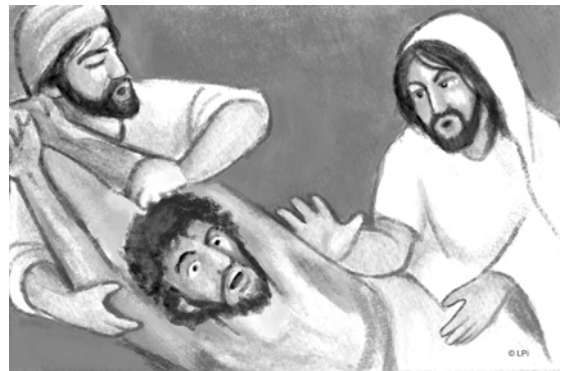

ST JOHN SCRIP NEWS

Do you know a child attending St. John School? You can help them by using the scrip program. All families of students at the school are eligible to receive a scrip rebate for half of the profit received by the school. When you place your scrip order, be sure to fill in the student's name at the top of the form and their family can benefit by your using the program

FAQ's of the St. John Scrip Program

Q: Where can I turn in my Scrip order?

A: Scrip orders may be sent in with any St. John School student or turned into the school or parish office on ANY day. All orders turned in before 8:30 AM on Monday mornings will be placed that Monday and be in on Friday of that same week. Scrip orders are placed every week.

Q: Do I have to pay for my order when I place it?

A: Yes, all orders must be paid for in advance. The school must pay for the order before it is shipped, therefore we must have received money from all orders.

Q: What forms of payment do you accept?

A: Payments for orders may be made in the form of cash or checks. We are not able to accept credit or debit cards. We have looked into accepting other forms of payments but fees would lower the percentages of profit that the school and families receive.

Q: Can anyone place scrip orders?

A: YES, anyone may use our program. Friends and Families of St. John School families can place orders on a specific students behalf. If you don't know a school family, your profit can go towards our school fund or Tuition Assistance.

Each scrip order form has a place to designate a SJ students name. Or if you buy from inventory, mention the student's name to the person selling the scrip cards and it will be noted on the inventory sheet.
